

30th Street Industrial Corridor



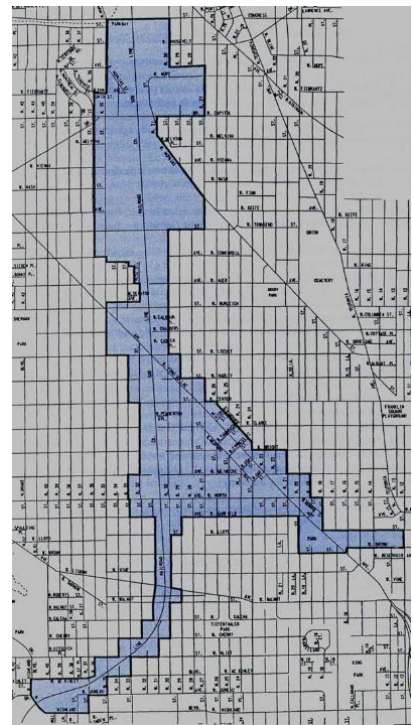
The 30th Street Industrial Corridor, in the heart of southeastern Wisconsin's manufacturing region, has a rich history as one of Milwaukee's leading manufacturing hubs. The area is home to several

multi-national companies as well as many other small to mid-size companies, including the headquarters of Harley Davidson and Miller Brewing on the south end of the corridor; Capitol Stampings and Master Lock in the central section; and Eaton Corporation and DRS Technologies on the north end.



Today, the 30th Street Corridor is an area ripe for both industrial and commercial development. Businesses in the corridor are supported by the 30th Street Industrial Corridor Corporation, a non-profit member-based organization that advocates on behalf of the corridor and provides a wealth of services and technical assistance to member firms. Additional assets of the corridor include:

- National rail line access connecting to Milwaukee's Port on Lake Michigan, offering world-wide shipping access.
- Local infrastructure providing close access to major interstate highways.
- Large metro-area labor pool.
- Comparitively low cost space.
- City, county, state, and federal resources available for all phases of manufacturing development, including assistance with business start-up or expansion, redevelopment, land assembly, and environmental remediation.
- Early stage planned development of contiguous industrial business park development sites, each offering rail line access.
- A variety of development sites, including a prime 145 acre inner-urban site available for industrial and business redevelopment.
- Comprehensive database of all industrially zoned properties in the corridor.
